All appointments will be scheduled for Fridays when our dental center is reserved just for you.


All appointments are tentative for the year and will be confirmed a few weeks ahead of time. Pencil them in your calendar so you're free

Legacy Spotlight: The Lints Family

In Resort District we're fortunate to have numerous legacy dental families. In this edition, we spotlight the remarkable Lints Family.

The Lints family's commitment to dental excellence has made an indelible mark on Northern Michigan's community. Dr. Ronald and Mary Lints met at a dental fraternity in Ann Arbor during the early 1980s, when Ron was a dental student and Mary was enrolled in the hygiene program. They were married at St. Robert's Church in 1988, and they have four wonderful sons.

Rooted in northern Michigan since the 1870s, the Lints family's history of hard work and community dedication laid the foundation for their outstanding dental practice. Ron's family members were farmers and worked many side jobs, including working at the Elk Rapids Iron Mill. Dr. Ron. Lints, inspired by the family dentist, Dr. William Graham, chose dentistry for its focus on patient well-being. His high school physiology teacher, Zandy Martineau, further ignited his passion for the health sciences.

Their family expanded with the addition of four sons: Joel, Kyle, Austin, and Ryan. Each pursued his unique path, with Joel, the eldest, following in his father's footsteps. Dr. Kyle Lints is a general dentist in Traverse City. Dr. Austin Lints, PharmD, is completing a fellowship in pharmaceutical oncology through Merck, and their youngest, Ryan, currently is attending medical school at Michigan State and plans to return to Northern Michigan.
